father is Greek Orthodox and his mother is Roman Catholic.



The Greek Orthodox Church is not in communion with Rome and so even though they have validly ordained deacons, priests, and bishops, as well as the teaching of the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, they do not recognize the authority of the Pope and the Ecumenical Councils since the Great Schism in 1054 A.D. Stamatinos will be making a **Profession of Faith** so that he will be in communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

Stamatinos attended Dr. Martin Leboldus High school and has been exposed more and more to the Catholic Church throughout his life. Sarah, his significant other and he have one child, Ava Maria, and another on the way. They are so excited!


