





Paying it Forward

Everyday our God is gifting us with prayers answered and unanswered. Opportunities are offered and with the gift of free will we are enabled to decide what we accept and what we do not.

At Easter we are reminded of the greatest gift of all, the Resurrection, which is central to our faith. Quoting St. Paul ... 1 Corinthians 15:14 (NIV) "And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith."



When we are confirmed we are given the Gifts of the Holy Spirit: right judgement, courage, knowledge, wisdom, reverence, wonder and awe, understanding as well as the Fruits: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control.

Have you ever asked yourself, why does God give these gifts, what is He expecting of me?

At RCIA we looked at Gifts we are given, why they are given and then responded for the first time as confirmed Catholics.

We learned that the gifts we are given are intended to be used as we are all called by Jesus in The Great Commission (Matthew 28: 19-20)



Flashback fläshbäk

In medical terms it is A flashback or involuntary recurrent memory is a psychological phenomenon in which an individual has a sudden, usually powerful, re-experiencing of a past experience or elements of a past experience.

Stewardship Bulletin Bit

"And Peter said to them, 'Repent, and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ..." Acts 2:38 The word "repent" means to turn from sin - to change our thoughts, words and actions. Change that is permanent comes from within – a transformation or conversion of heart. This requires prayer, discipline and perseverance. Change is hard. The first step is recognizing that we are broken and that we need God's help. The good news - we are not alone in our journey. Ask Jesus daily for guidance and patiently listen for his response.

Did you know... Ocean Man First Nation is a Cree, Saulteaux, and Nakota band located in the Moose Mountains north of Kisbey and has approximately 600 band members who reside on and off reserve. In 1901, Canada stopped recognizing Ocean Man as a First Nation after Canada wrongfully amalgamated Ocean Man, Pheasant Rump, and White Bear First Nations. In February 2022, Ocean Man was officially recognized as a Treaty 4 First Nation. In 1997, band members elected an all-female Chief and Council, the only First Nation in Canada to do this at the time.
