

### Letter for Solidarity Sunday

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Next Sunday, the Fifth Sunday of Lent, has for many years been known in Canada as Solidarity Sunday. On that day so close to the Commemoration of the Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection, we again take up a national collection for the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace (CCODP). This year their Share Lent campaign is called People and Planet First and encourages us to live more in communion with the peoples of the Global South.

In his Encyclical Letter *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis writes: "Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community. It means that the lives of all are prior to the appropriation of goods by a few. It also means combatting the structural causes of poverty, inequality, the lack of work, land and housing, the denial of social and labour rights. It means confronting the destructive effects of the empire of money. (#116)

The Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace has worked continuously since 1967 through partner organizations in the Global South to support authentic human development and lasting peace in those regions. Their efforts have helped Canadian Catholics to think and act "in terms of community" and provide regular charitable aid that has impacted countless lives.

In a spirit of solidarity and heart-felt charity, Development and Peace responded immediately to a crisis in a different part of the world: the horrific attack against Ukraine. An allocation of \$75,000 was made to assist with food, shelter, medical care, and transport to safe places for displaced or threatened persons. Although the collection on Solidarity Sunday funds CCODP's projects in the Global South, you may also wish to assist with their emergency appeal for the people of Ukraine. Donations to that fund can be made on their website, by calling 1-888-664-3387 or by mailing them a cheque drawn in favour of Development and Peace and marked *Emergency Ukraine*.

In this Season of Lent when we remember how God's Son became poor to enrich us with God's life and a new vision of universal love, it is a "favourable time" to express our deep commitment to our brothers and sisters who are in need.

Thank you for your sacrifices and prayers that bring so much good to our world.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Lent, let's put People and Planet First.

For more than 50 years, Development and Peace – Caritas Canada has responded to emergency situations and worked with local communities in many countries to help people from around our world. As the official solidarity organization of the Catholic Church in Canada, it puts a focus on democracy and citizen participation, ecological justice, peace and reconciliation and justice for women. It does this through partnerships with grassroots organizations working in communities in the Global South.

Thanks to the support of many Catholics like you, Development and Peace has been able to partner with Caritas Ukraine and deliver an emergency response of over \$500,000 to respond to the emerging humanitarian crisis in that country.

It has also partnered with organizations in countries which are vulnerable to climate change like Madagascar where they raised awareness and mobilized people to respond to the climate emergency in their region.

Activists in many countries of the Global South are threatened and criminalized for claiming the right to a healthy environment that is being threatened by corporate interests. Thanks to the solidarity expressed by many Catholics like you, they gain the strength to continue to speak out. In addition, Development and Peace is calling on the federal government to enact strong laws that would compel Canadian companies to respect human and environmental rights, wherever in the world they operate. If you have not yet signed the petition, it is not too late! This petition, Share Lent resources and information on the emerging crisis in Ukraine can be found on their website http://www.devp.org

This Lent, I urge you to take the time to reflect using the reflections and resources available from Development and Peace. Please prayerfully consider a generous contribution to Share Lent through the Solidarity Sunday collection, usually on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, at your parish, by becoming a Share Year-Round donor, or online through the website. This Lent, let's put People and Planet First! In the words of Pope Francis' message for Lent 2022, "In this season of conversion, ... let us not grow tired of doing good. The soil is prepared by fasting, watered by prayer and enriched by charity."

### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The theme of this year's Share Lent campaign is *People and Planet First* which is inspired by Pope Francis' encyclicals *Laudato Si* and *Fratelli Tutti*. The Holy Father began work on these encyclicals before the outbreak of the Covid 19 pandemic, and the current circumstances that our world faces today has rendered the central message of both papal letters all the more prophetic and urgent.

A key emphasis of Pope Francis is linking the love of neighbour – and especially those who make up the poorest nations and those on the social and geographical peripheries – with the care and protection of our global planet. Our CCCB president, Bishop Raymond Poisson quotes Pope Francis, who states in *Laudato Si*, "...a true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice I debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor."

Perhaps more than ever – in this environment of crisis and conflict (especially in Ukraine), fear, and social polarization– we need to hear the call of Christ and His Gospel to realize the meaning of being the People of God – who commit to a caring way of *all* our brothers and sisters.

This Lent, we can support the *People and Planet First* campaign by holding in our hearts and prayers those persons both locally and around the world who are on the peripheries of our communities because of poverty, conflict and war, separation from their homelands, illhealth, and many other circumstances even more magnified because of the current state of our world.

A time of crisis on this scale is especially a time when we need to be vigilant about the temptation to allow fear to fuel other 'sins', including prejudice and racism; unhealthy competition for limited resources, and a lack of caring and 'heart' for the brother and sister who is beyond our gaze and concern.

During this Lent, let us support the *People and Planet First* campaign by a renewed commitment to *have the same mind and heart as Christ Jesus* – who holds in His sacred heart all peoples of our world. The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops again designates the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent as Solidarity Sunday when our annual Share Lent collection will be taken up. On Sunday, April 3<sup>rd</sup> I ask you to please be generous in donating to Development and Peace.

### Position Title: Office Administrator (March 2022)

### **Overview:**

The Office Administrator is responsible for the completion of day to day operations including reception/office, records management, general administration, financial, security and miscellaneous duties as assigned.

The position deals with highly sensitive and confidential information.

The position reports directly to the Pastor/Administrator (hereinafter referred to as "Pastor").

### Activities and Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

### **Reception / Office**

• Greet / redirect and assist parishioners, public, and volunteers in person, over the telephone and by email

- Maintain an effective relationship with all parishioners and volunteers
- · Respond to inquiries within sphere of knowledge and ability
- Open, handle and distribute mail, prepare and process outgoing mail
- Order parish supplies and services, pick up when necessary, arrange for payment and maintain office equipment

• Administer the office's central email box – handle matters or forward to others for completion and follow-up as necessary to ensure inquiries are progressed

• Coordinate hall, room and church bookings for various functions

#### **Records Management**

- Primary administrator for parish software applications and paper records
- Maintain well organized parish files (hard copies and electronically)
- · Maintain a calendar and records of all hall, room and church bookings
- Record / schedule Mass and baptism requests, accept and record stipends, provide receipts
- Record Sacramental preparation registrations
- Maintain Parish Friendly data (enter, update, delete, reports, backup.

• Record baptism sacramental documents in various Registry books, Parish Friendly software, and parishioner files – complete requests from parishioners / former parishioners for their personal specific requests

#### **General Administration**

• Prepare documents (letters, reports, forms, emails)

• Prepare reports for distribution (e.g. Pastoral Council Annual General Meeting reports,

Finance Council reports to parishioners, weekly parish bulletins, reporting to the archdiocese)

• Provide administrative support to the Pastoral Council and Finance Council. This will include attending the meetings to record the minutes and preparing/issuing Council meeting packages at the direction of the respective Chair of each Council.

• Maintain various lists / documents / keys for office and building, record and distribute keys and alarm codes in accordance with the requirements set out

• Assist with contingency plan for computer server and files (both hard and e-files) according to systems support contractor (e.g. backs up Parish Friendly application on a weekly basis)

### Finance

· Count and verify collections as needed

- Make weekly bank deposits
- Maintain petty cash system

• Pick up, receive, count and deposit various monies (e.g. sale of items including Missals and calendars)

• Issue and finalize signed contracts for facility use and invoice for rental in accordance with the use and rental guidelines provided

- Input and run all processes in Parish Friendly systems regarding parishioner donations
- Review, validate, prepare, record and process receipt/payment of income and expenses
- Maintain outside contracts and renewals (e.g. copier, etc.)
- Receive monies and record same, prepare bank documents, deposits, etc.

- Prepare and process monthly priest pension costs and documentation
- Prepare and process monthly expenses related to church and rectory
- Prepare, record and issue donation envelopes
- Prepare and issue year-end tax receipts

• Provide direction to caretaker regarding room rental requirements, and provide instructions for other additional duties (e.g. additional / special cleaning)
