


# August 16, 2020 - 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time





# The Dismissal Connection

Luke 11:28 - "He replied, Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and obey it."

During the Catechumenate period of the RCIA process, the Candidates will be dismissed from Mass and with a facilitator and learn to listen to how God is speaking to them in the scripture. During this time the Candidates will begin a closer relationship with God and experience the richness and timeliness of the scripture as they witness how the scripture can speak to each of us in different ways more than 2000 years after it was written.

Sometimes called Dismissal, or Breaking Open the Word, as the facilitator at these sessions you will help the Candidates to explore the Gospel of the day. Dismissal happens during Mass, after the Homily and Prayers of intention. Your time together will end when Mass ends. You will be provided an outline to follow. This is a time to hear God speak, not a time for Catechesis. If the Candidates have questions about the Gospel, what is happening or why, a question box is provided for these questions to be recorded and answered at the next RCIA session.

Joan Fischer says:" I was privileged to join the candidates in the RCIA program at the dismissal to share their thoughts and feelings about the days scripture readings. It gave me an opportunity to meet them in person and I felt blessed to be part of the journey. It also gave me an opportunity to be more aware of my feelings with regard to the scripture. It was a special grace for me. "

Lisa Polk says:" I loved facilitating RCIA dismissal. I remember my own RCIA dismissal experience fondly. Facilitating just a few times this past year was a great way for me to get to know the candidates. Sharing of the Word with others allowed me to hear God speaking to me through all of the participants, looking at scripture with new eyes. The amount of time it took me was so small and the impact on my faith life has been strong. It's a wonderful way to engage in my parish community."
