The Catechesis Connection

1 Peter 3:15 - But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect.

One way we can share our faith is to pass on the Catholic teachings to the RCIA Candidates. In the Catechesis Period, the second period in the RCIA process, we spend time each evening exploring Catholic teachings on a variety of topics.

Is there a topic that you would like to share or a topic you would like to learn more about? Participating in RCIA as a Catchiest is the perfect opportunity to learn more about your faith and share Catholic teachings with seekers. The sessions are a comfortable opportunity to grow in your faith and preparedness to evangelize a different times when the opportunity is presented.

As a Catechist you will be provided with the key points to be covered, background materials to supplement your presentation, support to prepare and finalize your presentation. You will be encouraged to make your time with the candidates interactive and thought provoking, though the approach to the evening will be your choice, matching the style that is comfortable for you. On the assigned evening there will be 20-30 minutes allotted to share key points on the topic and answer questions with the support of the pastoral and RCIA team.

Our Catholic Church is meant to be alive and growing through evangelization and discipleship. Participating in the RCIA, is one way that we carry out that responsibility. 




