





As Christmas and the holidays approach, Christians experience the season of Advent as a time of expectant waiting and preparation. # Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2023 - Do good; seek justice (Isaiah 1:17) January 18 to 25, 2023

Learning to do right requires the decision to engage in self-reflection. The Week of Prayer is a time set aside for Christians to recognize that the divisions between our churches cannot be separated from divisions within the wider human family. Praying together for Christian unity allows us to reflect on what unites us and to commit ourselves to confront oppression and division amongst humanity.

The 2023 WPCU resources were developed by the Minnesota Council of Churches. They reflect the ecumenical work on racial justice in the U.S. following the murder of George Floyd in Minneapolis in May 2020.

Resources are now available at <a href="https://weekofprayer.ca">https://weekofprayer.ca</a>, including an order of worship, hymn suggestions, 8 days of scripture reflections on the theme, and materials for children and youth.

## **Ecumenical Log Drivers: Forming Agents of** Reconciliation for Church and World

The 2023 De Margerie Lectures on Christian Reconciliation and Unity Rt. Rev. Bruce Myers, OGS (Anglican Bishop of Quebec)

In the past century the ecumenical movement has made extraordinary efforts in healing the wounds of division in the church. However, despite efforts to educate and inspire successive generations of Christian leaders about the quest for the church's visible unity, an ecumenical malaise has set in which ignorance, fear, mistrust, suspicion, stereotypes, caricatures, recrimination, anathematization—even persecution continue in the relations between divided churches. Drawing on decades of reflection on ecumenical reception and formation, Bishop Myers presents an approach to teaching the practical and theological aspects of ecumenism in a way that is both holistic and pragmatic and offers the potential to raise up a new generation of church leaders who are also agents of reconciliation and Christian unity.



Bishop Myers has been bishop of Quebec since 2017. Raised on a farm in Glengarry County, Ontario, he studied at the University of Toronto before a decade as a parliamentary correspondent in Ottawa and Quebec City. He completed his theological studies at McGill University, Montreal Diocesan

Theological College, Bossey Ecumenical Institute, and the University of Geneva. He has recently completed a doctor of ministry at St. Paul University in Ottawa. He is a professed member of the Order of the Good Shepherd, an international community of Anglicans who share a common rule of life. Before election as bishop, he served parishes in Quebec City and the Magdalen Islands, and as Coordinator for Ecumenical and Interfaith

The De Margerie Lectures are named in honour of Fr. Bernard de Margerie, a priest of the Diocese of Saskatoon who has dedicated his whole life in ministry to the promotion of Christian unity. In this 11th year of the lecture series, we are expanding to offer lectures in both Regina and Saskatoon under the sponsorship of St. Thomas More College, the Prairie Centre for Ecumenism, the Archdiocese of Regina, and Campion College.

• November year-to-date financial results reflect a surplus of \$88,380


### A closer look at Mass Collections and Donations:

### Revenues:

The year to date Mass collections are \$26,842 lower than budgeted as well as overall donations are \$2,384 lower than budgeted. The budget was prepared last year with the anticipation there would be an increase in Mass attendance for fall 2022, the attendance has remained stable.

*Expenses:* Our expenses are 14.8 % less than budgeted year to date, a few of the building/maintenance expenses that were budgeted may still happen in December but likely early 2023. Also we had budgeted for a second priest as of August as well as part time youth position which are both still vacant.

Is the Catechism just a list of dogma and doctrine?

No. The Catechism is a complete summary of the history and tradition of Church doctrine. The content is explained by relying strongly on Sacred Scripture; as well as, the Church Fathers, liturgical texts, the writings and lives of saints. The people who heard and saw the words and actions of saints and scholars, tells us of the Church's ongoing, living tradition. Dogma is a part of doctrine declared by the Magisterium (the church's teaching authority) as an infallible truth revealed by God. Doctrine is the full and complete teachings of the church. Dogmas and Doctrines are received from the Apostles, who gave it to bishops and bishops give it to the faithful. In very simple terms, there are 255 dogmas contained in doctrine. See CCC# 88 & 90.


