TO All I alismoners of Resultection I alish,

Greetings as we enter this Holy Christmas season and ponder the meaning of the birth of our Lord into our world.

It seems the world is moving at an ever increasingly fast pace. Travel has steadily become more efficient, faster and more frequent (although recent long line ups at airports would seem to say otherwise). Information exchange and technological advances have accelerated at lightning speed. It can be disorienting as we try to make sense of things and stay grounded.

Though the pandemic seemed to slow the pace of things in many ways for a period of time, humanity continues to adapt and the world keeps relentlessly moving ahead with its heavy demands.

At this time of year our attention is drawn more toward the deeper meaning in our lives. We are drawn to think of our families. Whether we have the luxury of coming together physically or not, it's a time when we can take another step toward accepting each other and ourselves as we are, with all our respective warts. It is, famously and sadly, also a time of greatest loneliness for many. For some it is the first Christmas without a loved one with whom they shared many Christmases. For others it is a reminder of the brokenness of family ties and the dysfunction in relationships. For those in such difficult states, the sight of happy families can trigger a deeper loneliness.

Yet there is a longing and loneliness in every one of us that runs more deeply than anything a satisfying family gathering can achieve. As Ron Rolheiser points out, 'when we can accept an inevitable separateness, moral loneliness, and disappointment, we can begin to console each other in our friendships and marriages.'

In spite of all the brokenness and hurt in the world, which seems to be in our faces at every moment, can we focus on the good things and on our strengths, bring them to the surface, and say them out loud to ourselves and to each other?

Christmas can be a time when we renegotiate our own identity and the way we see each other.

Francis Bacon once said, 'Imagination was given to humanity to compensate for what we are not. A sense of humor was given to console us for what we are.'

Remember also, Rudolph the red nosed reindeer came to be accepted for who he is. He never did get a nose job. We all have our weaknesses but we all have our strengths.


The infant Jesus grew up to reveal to our world that we have been claimed for a higher purpose. Life in this world is not a dead-end street but a gate way to eternity. Christ has revealed Himself to us as our strength, our guide, our Savior. He invites us to new possibilities in Him, with Him, and through Him. Ultimately what prospect could be more interesting and fruitful?

During these times we ponder what Jesus has offered the wo<mark>rld. Richard Ro</mark>hr articulates this as, 'a living example of fully embodied Love that emerged out of our ordinary, limited life situations; in other words, 'living in the limitations of weakness'. (Hebrews 4:15)



Is the Catechism just a list of dogma and doctrine?

No. The Catechism is a complete summary of the history and tradition of Church doctrine. The content is explained by relying strongly on Sacred Scripture; as well as, the Church Fathers, liturgical texts, the writings and lives of saints. The people who heard and saw the words and actions of saints and scholars, tells us of the Church's ongoing, living tradition. Dogma is a part of doctrine declared by the Magisterium (the church's teaching authority) as an infallible truth revealed by God. Doctrine is the full and complete teachings of the church. Dogmas and Doctrines are received from the Apostles, who gave it to bishops and bishops give it to the faithful. In very simple terms, there are 255 dogmas contained in doctrine. See CCC# 88 & 90.


