# Easter

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In recent weeks during the Lenten season, our Gospel readings have directed our attention to the ways in which the Lord brought healing during his earthly life. We discover him as the quencher of spiritual thirst, a thirst which we all have but often cannot name or identify, as the one who introduces us to an awareness of the living waters that never run dry. We also experience Him as the Light of Life - - the healer from the blindness that plagues the world, and then, revealed as one with the power to restore life from death.

All these events in Jesus' earthly ministry help us identify Him with the Father in Heaven, Creator God, who is the source of life itself. As we accept the invitation to follow Him, we begin to consciously participate in His mission of love, entering into loving relationship between the Father and the Son through the Holy Spirit.



This weekend we celebrate Easter, the Pascal Mystery, the death and Resurrection of Jesus, Son of God, from the dead. It is His death and resurrection that gives rise to our faith in life beyond what we experience at this external earthly level. It is a constant reminder that there is always more mystery to life than we can ever fully comprehend by ourselves and that the power of the Holy Spirit is at work in the world.

The love of God is gradually being revealed and is intended to be experienced by all of humanity. We see this gradual revelation throughout salvation history as portrayed in the Old Testament, culminating in the birth of the Savior into the world, and followed by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

We encapsulate the telling of that story at the Easter Vigil. We also encounter this gradual revelation in our personal lives through self-examination and in recognizing that the struggles of Israel in their relationship with God is our struggle.

The story of Israel is our story. It is a story of an invitation to true freedom from the slavery of sin.

It begins at our baptism into Jesus' death and resurrection. We thereby officially enter into the story of salvation and through His Church, we are called to become Christ-like and to participate in His mission to the world.

May this Easter season be a time of deeper recognition of our dignity as children of God in a broken world and a celebration of life as Our Creator God intends it to be for us. May we all be signs of light and love for the world as brothers and sisters in Christ.

### Resurrection Knights of Columbus Sponsors Silver Rose in Honor of Life and Our Lady of Guadalupe

A silver rose on a nine-month pilgrimage will be the centerpiece of a special mass & prayer service at Resurrection Parish at 7:00 PM on Tuesday, April 18<sup>th</sup>.

This mass and prayer service will honor Our Lady of Guadalupe and express both international unity and dedication to the sanctity of human life.

The journey of the silver rose begins each year in March and ends on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. During that time, Silver Roses travel from town to town along eight routes throughout North America. Several of those routes begin in Canada and end in Mexico.

The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when the first rose – a real, live one – was blessed by a bishop in Ontario, California. The rose then traveled to New York and then to Texas where it was taken across the border into Mexico. The rose ended its pilgrimage at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. To better ensure future annual trips, a silver rose was ultimately made. Today, due to the popularity of the program throughout the North American continent, eight silver roses travel unique routes.

In 2001, when Carl Anderson, Past Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus, expanded the Silver Rose Program, he commented: "Through [the Silver Rose Program] we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the [Knights of Columbus], but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

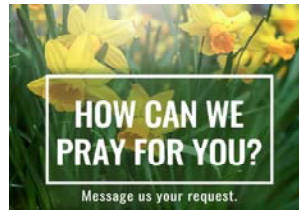

## A Word About Trauma...

Trauma and associated words are being used more now than ever. Do we know the origins of these words? Are their meanings different now than when they were first used? Each week we will explore a trauma-associated word's origins, meanings and evolution.

### Shame: (SHam) Noun

A painful feeling of humiliation Verb: - used as an object - to cause or force humiliation. From old English scamu or sceomu "painful feeling of guilt or disgrace" by C 1300 "modesty, shyness, regard for propriety, or decency" in mid-13c "inflict disgrace or dishonour upon" by 1580s evolved to "thing or person to be ashamed of" Shame can be described as a negative emotion that may involve pervasive and destructive beliefs about yourself and your sense of self, leading to feeling worthless or inferior—trauma and shame or closely linked. Intimate partner violence or childhood abuse or neglect, and sexual violence are associated with greater feelings of shame.

The Catholic hospital chaplains at the Regina facilities are seeking volunteers with the time and gifts to be able to serve as relief chaplains. Ideally, you would have taken at least one unit of CPE (Clinical Pastoral Education) or be willing to enroll in the near future. ## LESSON EIGHTEEN

**FAQ:** Does the Catechism remove the content of faith too much from the lived Christian life?

The largest portion of the Catechism treats the content of the faith (Book One), but the second largest treats the moral life (Book Three). The relationship between what one believes and how one behaves on account of that belief is clear in the Catechism. It is evident in the sections on social teachings. Faith is presented as more than the systematic knowledge of doctrine. Each section of the Catechism should be read in light of the whole, and the relationship between faith and life needs to be demonstrated continually so that the transforming power of the Christian message might be evident.
