



Lenten Reflection – Introduction

The season of Lent is a gift we give ourselves amidst the chaos of our busy lives. It is a time to slow down and focus on what is most important. This is the gift of Sabbath so that we can reflect on how we are living out lives of holiness or not. We are called to take time out of our day to fast, pray, give alms, and meditate on our relationship with God, our neighbour, creation, and ourselves. This year, you are invited to pray, fast, and give alms with acts of solidarity for the 117.2 million refugees worldwide. Your prayer is, of course, your own, but we will also send out these weekly reflections. Everyone is encouraged to fast by eating like a Syrian refugee in a refugee camp in Jordan. The suggestion for almsgiving is to compare your monthly food bills to what you spend "eating like a refugee" and donate the difference.

Food for one person for one week:

2 ³/₄ cups of rice 1 c dry lentils

½ c dried chickpeas One can of tinned sardines (small)

One 400 gr can of kidney beans 1 1/3 cups vegetable oil

I see this list and cringe at the thought of no coffee, garlic, vegetables, or cheese. They do not get to say, "I don't like sardines. Can I have summer sausage instead?" I will try my best to dive into this experience. No meals out, no nighttime tea with honey, no fruit or vegetables. I am not even going to put soy sauce on my rice. I will have a cup of black coffee each morning, but I will try to hold this fast, even on Sundays. Refugees do not get a mini-Easter reprieve. I encourage you to engage in this as much as you can. Make accommodations as you need, as is always the case with your Lenten fasting. However, take this opportunity to reflect on how little agency and power is afforded these people. If you are diabetic or have alleraies and are a refugee, there is not much wiggle room. Whatever choices you make for lent, be safe. Each week there will be a weekly Lenten reflection based on the Sunday readings posted to our Facebook page and linked to our website. Maybe your parish wants to print a few off, and you can share them as a small group after Mass at coffee. These could serve as journaling entries or as a conversation at supper. Use these reflections privately, in your classroom, lunchroom, or wherever works best for you. Please share and encourage others to participate.



Our Lenten readings and reflections focus on the themes of communal and original sin, leaving home, relying on others' hospitality, water, the moralizing of poverty/suffering, and new life. You will also have the chance to hear some first-hand experiences of Canadians who were refugees.

For your almsgiving, you are encouraged to donate the difference between what you normally spend on food, eating out, beverages, alcohol, snacks, gum, etc., from the cost of eating like a refugee. There are many great places for you to donate that money. If you want to help directly with refugees, there are a few options:

- The Archdiocese of Regina Annual Appeal. In the memo state that this is a donation for "refugee." We help sponsor and support around 50-70 refugees each year, and are working hard to expand that number. Your donations would greatly help.
- Your Parish's social justice committee if they are interested in sponsoring a refugee. For more information, contact Tashia Toupin.
- You could also donate to your local "Newcomer Welcome Centre." Just Google that phrase and the name of your city/town and it will show up.
- In Regina, the Immigrant Women's Centre https://reginaiwc.ca/ supports language classes and learning for all or newcomers.
- Also in Regina the Open Door Society https://rods.sk.ca/ helps provides so many supports for Newcomers, homework help, interpretation, computer classes, writing and job skills training.
- Any of your public Libraries help support Refugees and Newcomers too.
- If you would like to support a proactive NGO donate to Development and Peace-Caritas Canada (DPCC) on the fifth week of Lent for Solidarity Sunday. DPCC helps create durable solutions for people in their countries so they can solve the problems that create refugees in the first place.

One last thing, you may want to consider purchasing your food from an ethnic store in town that is owned and operated by Newcomers. They need your support, and you might be able to share a bit of your story and hear theirs too. Happy Lent, everyone! A Word About Trauma...

Trauma and associated words are being used more now than ever. Do we know the origins of these words? Are their meanings different now than when they were first used? Each week we will explore a trauma-associated word's origins, meanings and evolution.

Pain

/pān/

In 1297 English, the word peyn came from Old French peine, which came from Latin poena meaning "punishment, penalty." In late Latin, it meant to torment, hardship and suffering. Greek ποινή (poine) with a general meaning of "price paid, penalty, punishment."

In 1644 Descartes' theory was that pain passed along nerve fibres as a disturbance that reached the brain. Descartes's and Avicenna's work evolved to the Specificity theory saw pain as "a specific sensation, with its sensory apparatus independent of touch and other senses." By the end of the 1800s, pain specificity was presented as fact.

Pain is an adaptive response that naturally protects our body from actual or potential injury. It is thought to be a signal from your nervous system that something is wrong. It is an unpleasant subjective sensation that may be constant, intermittent, sharp or dull, aches, tingling, burning, or stinging. It causes physical suffering or discomfort caused by illness or injury. There are differing opinions on whether pain is an emotion that results in mental suffering or distress. Pain is experienced differently by people.

Love your enemies, easier said than done. But, remember, the foundation of stewardship is prayer. When we are in close communication with God, it opens our heart and it turns our attention away from "me" and moves it towards God and others. It changes my heart and actions, allowing for a little more empathy for "my enemy." When we pray for others, even our enemies, it may soften their hearts as well.

Did you know... Fishing Lake First Nation is a Saulteaux branch of the Ojibwe Nation and is located southwest of Wadena, Saskatchewan. Originally from central Canada, they were part of the Yellow Quill Saulteaux Nation. Chief Yellow Quill signed an adhesion to Treaty 4 in 1876. In the 1880's, Yellow Quill Saulteaux First nation was separated into three reserves (Nut Lake, Fishing Lake, and Kinistino). Fishing Lake First Nation was officially recognized as a separate First Nation in 1907. The population is approximately 2,000 and members live on and off the reserve. The First Nation has a new K – 12 school and business ventures including a full service camp management company. LESSON TWELVE

If the Catechism presents Catholic doctrine in a organized way, is the context of that doctrine ignored? Example: God's relationship with his people.

God's "covenant" is evident throughout the Catechism and interwoven to provide a unified whole. While the content of some European catechisms are organized according to the "covenant," the text of the Catechism normally used in Canada makes regular references to God's relationship with his people.

There is a teaching that it is not possible, on earth, for the human intellect to comprehend God in His fullness, but possibly seen at the Beatific Vision (visio beatifica).

St. Augustine: Sermon 67, #5: "Si comprehendus, non est Deus", or: if you comprehend it, then it's not God. The moment we think to understand God's plan in our life, is the moment we are wrong. God simply "IS" and beyond all understanding.

St. Thomas Aquinas: Summa Theologiae tackles "all things God" by providing theories of God's nature, such as: proof, existence and attributes of God. without defining "who God is".


