



IS THERE AN ALTERNATIVE TO MAID?



Dr. David Kopriva

The Catholic Church is strongly opposed to medical assistance in dying (MAiD) and euthanasia. The Church believes all human life is sacred, from conception to natural death, and everyone should be protected. The Church also offers hope and mercy to those who are suffering. The Catholic Church believes that causing death to eliminate suffering is morally unacceptable and constitutes murder. No one wants to see their loved ones suffer – or for ourselves to suffer needlessly? So what is the answer? Dr. David Kopriva, a local surgeon and parishioner of St. Anne Catholic Parish in Regina, will speak to this question – and help answer questions you may have on the topic. *Dr. David will be at Our Lady of Peace Parish speaking briefly at both Masses on the weekend of January 18th and 19th. Immediately following the 10:00 am Mass on Sunday January 19th he will speak further to the topic. (about a one hour session).* This will be an opportune time to ask questions and hear what the Church has to offer as an alternative to MAiD.
