

IMPORTANT MESSAGE REGARDING ACTIVITIES AT RESURRECTION PARISH



Reconciliation

This week at RCIA we explored the sacrament of Reconciliation.

While Baptism washes away our sins, we know as broken humans we will invariably sin again.

When we sin our relationship with God is weakened, through the sacrament our relationship can be restored.

Regular celebration of the sacrament is essential to spiritual growth.

Before receiving the sacrament, we prepare by doing an examination of conscience.

During Lent, baptised RCIA Candidates will celebrate Reconciliation. To prepare we will use the Hallow app to do a guided examination of conscience.




