## 1. May Year to Date Financial Results - Operations



### 2. Highlights of Financials

- As shown above our May 31st, 2023 surplus is \$2395 our May 31st, 2022 surplus was \$64,741.
- Revenues are lower than last year as we have less donations, and expenses are higher than last year due
  to increased costs for utilities as well as more expenditures for ministry and faith based programs happening
  within our Parish.
- Remaining Debt as of May 31<sup>st</sup> is \$507,160.

- ➤ Since January 2023 we have welcomed and hosted 33 Parish Partner events. These events include Archdiocesan workshops and meetings, Regina Catholic School meetings/celebrations, and CWL and Knights of Columbus meetings/celebrations. We are grateful that we are able to host these events to help promote our Catholic faith and teachings.
- ➤ During the summer months we will start our regular scheduled maintenance of our Parish, this includes floor waxing, carpet cleaning and replacing interior and exterior lights as needed. We have recently painted the lines in the parking lot and will also begin doing upgrades to our Wifi and projectors in the church.
- We thank you all for your ongoing support to help us to maintain responsible upkeep of our Church and overall building!



#### A Word About Trauma...

Trauma and associated words are being used more now than ever. Do we know the origins of these words? Are their meanings different now than when they were first used? Each week we will explore a trauma-associated word's origins, meanings and evolution.

#### Coping cop·ing

Coping is a dynamic process that involves both cognitive and behavioural changes to manage stress. There are two major categories of coping: problem-focused and emotion-focused coping. Old English cope dress in cope and moving to mid 16th century. Coping refers to conscious strategies used to reduce unpleasant emotions. Coping strategies can be cognitions or behaviours and can be individual or social. The fact of dealing successfully with problems or difficult situations: a coping mechanism/ strategy, coping skills/abilities.

The Canadian Constitution recognizes these three groups as Aboriginal peoples, also known as Indigenous peoples. Although these groups share many similarities, they each have their own distinct heritage, language, cultural practices and spiritual beliefs.In cooperation with Indigenous organizations, the Government of Canada chose June 21, the summer solstice, for National Aboriginal Day, now known as National Indigenous Peoples Day. For generations, many Indigenous peoples and communities have celebrated their culture and heritage on or near this day due to the significance of the summer solstice as the longest day of the year. **itwewin Corner** (itwewin is the Cree word which means 'the word' or 'as it is said...') Fr. John Weckend, Archdiocese of Regina Truth and Reconciliation Healing Committee.

Did you know... Star Blanket Cree Nation is located 18 kms northeast of Balcarres with a population of approximately 725 members. The nation is named after Chief Acahkoa ka-otakohpit (One who has stars for a blanket). Chief Wah-pi-moos-toosis (White Calf), a leader of the Calling River Cree signed Treaty 4 in 1874. In October 2022, globalnews. ca/news/9409684/next-steps-star-blanket-cree-nationanomalies-residential-school/ between ages 4 and 6 was found at the site of Lebret Indian Residential School. The Saskatchewan Coroner's Office confirmed that it aged at about 125 years old dating back to 1898, physical proof of an unmarked grave. Indigenous survivors of residential schools have always said that many children died for nefarious reasons at these institutions. Many children did not return home. The Nation continues its search for unmarked children's graves at the site.

The Saint Philomena Walking Pilgrimage, sponsored by the Archdiocese of Regina, will be happening again this year. We start on August 11th in Yorkton and finish on August 14th at Rama. This is a guided pilgrimage with rest stops, meals, support vehicles, and a trailer carrying tents and sleeping gear to each overnight stop. 
