

Pastoral and Finance Councils

"How can we make this big parish feel small?" Over 2,000 people - part of over 2300 families belong to Resurrection Parish. Our Mission is to grow in our own faith, deepen our roots in our faith, and deepen the relationship that each one of us has with Christ and with each other in Christ. As well, we want to reach beyond the walls of our church and our current parishioners, into our community, to share and spread God's love, joy and Word to our neighbors and community.

Pastoral Council

<u>Pastoral Council Chair</u> leads and coordinates the works of the Pastoral council. The chair is responsible for keeping parishioners informed and developing and maintaining good relations between parishioners and the parish organizations, other parishes and the public. The chair of this committee shall work with the fundraising committee and/or the Finance Council as required.

Hospitality is responsible for distributing welcome kits to new parishioners, coordinate social events throughout year like a parish/community barbeque, pancake breakfasts, Harvest Supper, Bingo, Halloween party etc.

<u>Ministry of Care</u> provides Pastoral Care to parishioners and their families who are sick, elderly, homebound, or experiencing a time of need or in need of care. (ie. Communion to shutins, bereavement support sessions, World Day of Sick and the Adopt-A-Senior Program.

<u>Social Justice</u> is responsible for the development of programs, on-going education (Church's biblical and social teachings) and involvement within justice and service issues at the local, national and international level.

Spiritual Development - develops, promotes, and monitors educational and spiritual programs and activities which respond to the parishioner's faith and spiritual needs. (ie. Monday's for Mom's drop in group; Rosary Days; Bible Studies; parish based retreats)

Recorder is responsible to record and prepare the minutes of parish council meetings.

<u>Stewardship</u> is responsible for creating awareness in all parishioners that everything we have comes from God: our life, our talents, our abilities, our intellectual gifts, our resources, and our holiness. There is only one chair who serves on both Pastoral and Finance Councils.

Finance Council

<u>Finance Council Vice-Chair</u> assists the Finance Chair with leading the advisory body responsible for safeguarding the finances and assets of Resurrection Parish and ensuring financial data is communicated to pastor, pastoral council and sub-committees and all other affected parties. A business background, especially financial and accountings skills, is valuable.

<u>Financial Administration</u> is responsible for maintaining an inventory of temporal goods, develop collection counter procedures, help establish parish budget, monitor parish revenue flow, and ensure prompt payment of parish accounts.

Fundraising develops and coordinates fundraising activities to raise funds to augment financial needs of the parish.

Buildings and Grounds oversees the physical maintenance of the church building, the church grounds, and the rectory.

SHARE LENT 2021

To the Pastor / Pastoral Associate/ Faithful of the Archdiocese of Regina

(To be read on the 3rd Sunday in Lent: March 20th & 21st, 2021)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ of the Archdiocese of Regina,

Warm greetings as we approach the Fifth Sunday of Lent, 'Solidarity Sunday', the day designated by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops for a collection for Development and Peace's Share Lent Campaign. As you may remember, the pandemic hit at exactly this time last year, preventing us from taking up the Share Lent collection last Spring, as our parishes were closed by the time we reached Solidarity Sunday.

During the past year, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops and Development and Peace have continued their conversation and taken significant steps towards resolving areas of tension around sponsorship partners. I am grateful to say that we can wholeheartedly support the Share Lent collection, trusting in the moral and social integrity of Development and Peace partners. The season of Lent invites us to consider the traditional practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Almsgiving is a way of linking us more closely to those in need around us. Often Christ beckons to us through people who are most poor and marginalized, both locally and globally. Now into our second year of the global pandemic, there is much upheaval many of our lives. This is even more true for our many brothers and sisters living in Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Middle East – excluded and marginalized by a myriad of circumstances, including increased vulnerability to the virus.

I invite you to give as you can on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, March 21st, and equally to engage in the learning, fasting and prayer opportunities that Development and Peace is providing: https://www.devp.org/en/region-events/sharelent2021. 
