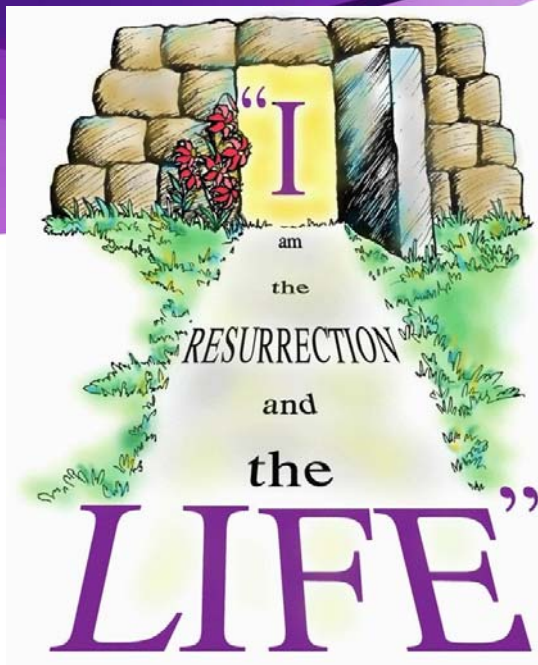

## **Pastoral and Finance Councils**

"How can we make this big parish feel small?" Over 4,300 people - part of over 1400 families belong to Resurrection Parish. Our Mission is to grow in our own faith, deepen our roots in our faith, and deepen the relationship that each one of us has with Christ and with each other in Christ. As well, we want to reach beyond the walls of our church and our current parishioners, into our community, to share and spread God's love, joy and Word to our neighbors and community.

### **Pastoral Council**

**Vice Chair** is responsible to assist the Pastoral Chair with pastoral council duties and temporarily assume these duties when the Chair is absent. This includes keeping parishioners informed and developing and maintaining good relations between parishioners and the parish organizations, and other parishes and the public.

**Ecumenism** is responsible for the education of the Parish on ecumenical issues. This committee shall act as a liaison with other Christian churches and other faith groups in the area and in the development of inter-church activities. Help coordinate and promote Praise in the Park, World Day of Prayer.

**Stewardship** is responsible for creating awareness in all parishioners that everything we have comes from God: our life, our talents, our abilities, our intellectual gifts, our resources, and our holiness. There is only one chair who serves on both Pastoral and Finance Councils.

**Recorder** is responsible to assist the Pastoral Chair at pastoral council meetings. Duties include recording the meeting minutes and providing them to the Pastoral Chair for distribution to the committee

### **Finance Council**

**Finance Council Vice Chair** assists the Finance Chair with leading the advisory body responsible for safeguarding the finances and assets of Resurrection Parish and ensuring financial data is communicated to pastor, pastoral council and sub-committees and all other affected parties. A business background, especially financial and accountings skills, is valuable.

**Fundraising** develops and coordinates fundraising activities to raise funds to augment financial needs of the parish.





# THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

## *Examination of Conscience*

### **I AM THE LORD YOUR GOD, YOU SHALL HAVE NO OTHER GODS**

- ◆ Do I make a god out of my work, my possessions, my impulses and desires or my own image in the eyes of others, so that these rule my life instead of God?
- ◆ Do I try to grow in knowledge of God by daily prayer, Scripture reading, and honest study of the Church's teachings?
- ◆ Have I ever dabbled in the occult or given credence to horoscopes, Ouija boards, channeling, tarot cards, superstition or fortune telling?
- ◆ Do I easily give up on God's grace and willingness to help me in times of distress?

### **YOU SHALL NOT TAKE THE NAME OF YOUR LORD IN VAIN**

- ◆ Have I resorted to profane language by cursing and swearing?
- ◆ In conversations, have I assented to slander and jokes aimed at demeaning religion, the Church, or God's authority?

### **REMEMBER THE SABBATH DAY, TO KEEP IT HOLY**

- ◆ Have I allowed myself to be so dominated by my work or the activities of life that I don't go to Mass every Sunday?
- ◆ Do I prioritize coming to Mass every Sunday and Holy Day, or do I rationalize that "God won't mind if I miss now and then," or "Going to church once in a while is good enough— most people don't even go at all."
- ◆ In my prayer and attendance at Holy Mass, am I content with passive or ritualistic observance rather than devoting myself to true worship?
- ◆ Do I make the effort to actively engage my heart when I come to worship at Mass?

### **HONOR YOUR FATHER AND MOTHER**

- ◆ As an adult, am I genuine with my parents in charity and truth to foster genuine relationships?
- ◆ Have I legitimately tried to work out problems with my parents according to the truth of the teachings of the Church?

### **YOU SHALL NOT KILL**

- ◆ Have I harmed anyone with unjust anger toward them?
- ◆ Have I developed a habit of speaking and behaving toward my family or others which is abusive or demeaning?
- ◆ Do I secretly tolerate a culture where abortion is available and treated as a right even though life is the most basic right given by God?
- ◆ Have I ever advocated abortion, either through my opinions, in conversation, or by actively assisting someone in procuring one?
- ◆ Have I ever endangered myself or the life of another person by taking drugs or abusing alcohol?

### **YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY**

- ◆ Have I misused the gift of my sexuality or others through sexual acts outside marriage with anyone of either sex, contraceptive acts within marriage, masturbation, giving my mind over to lustful thoughts, fantasies, or pornography?
- ◆ Am I respectful in dress and speech regarding human sexuality or do I enjoy lewd jokes and obscene discussions or stories?
- ◆ Do I promote a healthy and generous relationship with my spouse so that I may honor my marriage vows?

### **YOU SHALL NOT STEAL**

- ◆ Have I taken anything that did not belong to me?
- ◆ Have I been dishonest in the payment of my taxes or in my business?
- ◆ Have I cheated my employer by wasting time and not doing a full day's work?
- ◆ Have I been extravagant in my manner of life, to the neglect of real needs of my family or of the poor?
- ◆ Have I been slothful and lazy in fulfilling my promises and commitments to God, myself, and others in my family or workplace?

### **YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR**

- ◆ Have I defamed someone's good name by taking part in gossip or slander?
- ◆ Have I injured the reputations of other people by speaking about their failures and sins with little desire or intention to help them?
- ◆ Have I condoned prejudice and ill-feeling towards members of the opposite sex or people of another nationality, race, religion or sexual orientation?
- ◆ Do I correct others when they are speaking unfairly or untruthfully about another?

### **YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOR'S WIFE**

- ◆ Have I sought the affections of another's spouse?
- ◆ Have I indulged in fantasies or infidelity against my spouse?
- ◆ Have I rejected my family in my heart, wishing to distance myself emotionally and personally from them for selfish or unjust reasons?

### **YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOR'S GOODS**

- ◆ Do I habitually compare myself with others in terms of wealth, status, and financial security?
- ◆ Am I jealous of the personal qualities of others or envious of their possessions or success?
- ◆ Do I keep my finances in order and exercise proper stewardship over what is mine?
- ◆ Do I support my Church according to my means and give generously to the poor?

Dear friends in Christ,

Blessings to you on your Lenten journey! In the Gospels we have heard in recent Sundays, we see how Jesus does not dwell among the powerful, the proud, or those in high places, but instead chooses to be among the excluded, the voiceless, the sick, and the suffering. Jesus chose to include those on the margins of society. He drinks with the Samaritan woman, forgives and heals the man born blind, and shares his ministry with those who deny him. We are faced with many opportunities to choose the path of Christ and walk on the margins and love as he loves.

This Lent, I heartily encourage you to learn more about the needs, experiences, and success of some of our partners by reading materials in your parishes, or by going to the website. When you support Development and Peace, these people become your partners as well. Carry these stories in your heart, and pray for our partners and the life-saving work they do.

In Colombia, the ACA (*Association Campesina de Antioquia*) empowers everyday people to exercise their rights and protect their land. They promote ecological sustainability and holistic public policy by utilizing the concept of *buen vivir* (living well), demonstrating the unique beauty and strength of their Indigenous way of life and sharing this with others.



In Honduras, ERIC (*Equipo de Reflexión y Comunicación*), works to document land and human rights abuses. They then help to defend those affected, with legal counsel. They broadcast information on public radio to increase awareness about human rights violations, thus promoting justice and freedom of expression.

Development and Peace Caritas Canada has 66 active partners in 40 countries, affecting change for thousands of people. ### A Word About Trauma...

Trauma and associated words are being used more now than ever. Do we know the origins of these words? Are their meanings different now than when they were first used? Each week we will explore a trauma-associated word's origins, meanings and evolution.

#### Shock [shok]

Origins are in middle Dutch schokken – to push, jolt, shake or jerk. First attributed to Le Bran in 1743 regarding a gunshot wound and the bodily reaction to sudden impact. Shock can be an emotional state of mine, usually resulting from a traumatic event; the physical aspect of shock is described as too little blood flow to the brain and vital organs or delivering an electrical charge, such as when used to restart the heart.

### LESSON SIXTEEN

**FAQ:** Is the Catechism a spiritual book in any sense? The Catechism's spirituality rests on the Trinitarian life. The relationships among the persons of the Trinity provide the model for human relationships. To put the Catechism in the context of prayer, some suggest reading Book Four (Prayer) first. It can be read from the point of view of a spiritual journey in how the Church believes, celebrates, lives and prays to assist in formation with hope of transformation by God's grace. Placing the Trinity as the organizing principle of the Catechism assures its spiritual orientation.

Did you know... Kinistin Saulteaux First Nation is located near the town of Melfort, SK and has a population of approximately 1,100 members. Kinistin is named after Chief Kinistin a headman of Chief Osawaskokwanepi's Yellow-quill Saulteaux band. Chief Osawaskokwanepi signed an adhesion to Treaty 4 on August 24, 1876. The Yellow-quill Saulteaux band was later divided into three groups with a group headed by Chief Kinistin becoming Kinistin Saulteaux Nation. The construction of the Tikinagan Family Resource Centre [globalnews.ca/news/8964460/kinistin-saulteaux-nation-getting-tikinagan-familie-resource-centre/](http://globalnews.ca/news/8964460/kinistin-saulteaux-nation-getting-tikinagan-familie-resource-centre/) ('tikinagan' translates to 'cradleboard' in Cree) is underway and will house family support services.
