Feb 28th, 2021 FINANCIAL UPDATE


1. February Year to Date Financial Results - Operations:


- February year-to-date financial results reflect a surplus of \$19,062
- A closer look at Mass Collections and Donations:

Revenues: When the 2021 budget was prepared in December, 2020 it was planned with the hopes of a slight shift of more people being able to attend Mass, resulting in higher Mass Collections and lower Donations unfortunately to date that has not happened.

Therefore the year to date Mass Collections are \$14,405 lower than budgeted but gratefully the year to date overall donations are \$13,472 higher than budgeted.

Expenses: Management continues to focus on cost effectiveness.

2. Remaining debt as of Feb 28th, 2021 is: \$1,274,418.

One of the finance council goals this year is to focus on debt repayment.

3. The Government of Canada Wage Subsidy program has been extended into 2021 at a declining percentage rate therefore subsidy amount will be drastically decreased in 2021. We are very grateful for the amount we have received in 2020!

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ of the Archdiocese of Regina,

Warm greetings in the Lord as we reach the mid-point of Lent and prepare our minds and hearts to enter into the great mystery of Jesus' dying and rising for us. The new life which rises with the Lord from the tomb is the foundational inspiration for all of our efforts to protect, uphold and celebrate human life.

As we approach Spring, I want to bring to your attention that we have moved Reverence for Life month from October to May. Spring is always a time of renewed expectations and energy. This move will allow us to open our hearts and minds to the wonderful gift of life at the same time as the world springs forth with new life.

The Reverence for Life Commission is presently drawing together plans to assist us to renew and reenergize living out our belief in the sanctity of life. Saint John Paul II, in his encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*, reminds us that "[society as a whole must respect, defend and promote the dignity of every human person, at every moment and in every condition of that person's life" (*EV*, 81).

I encourage every parish to truly make May a time to focus on the needs of the unborn, the elderly, the sick, the lonely, the hungry and the abandoned with special prayer and works of mercy. To do this work we need to be "strong and courageous" (Deut. 31:6). There are several activities that the Reverence for Life Commission has initiated or is encouraging to help us achieve this work. I invite you to consider joining in the following:

- holding special prayer services at the memorials for the unborn;
- encouraging people to pray the Reverence for Life prayer daily;
- holding an evening of prayer for Life with recitation of the Rosary and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament;
- promoting and joining a webinar organized by the Reverence for Life Commission, or hosting your own educational sessions (video or guest speaker);
- finding new ways to reach out to the shut-ins;
- organizing food/clothing drives for needy organizations;
- collecting clothing and furniture for an immigrant or refugee family.

Covid-19 has been a tremendous struggle and with continued diligence in following the recommendations of the health authorities and prayer for God's mercy, we will soon be able to fully open our churches. Let us take every opportunity to truly make 2021 a year of rebirth.

- Saskatchewan health card

- Confirmation of booking will be sent by text or email. You will also receive a notification 24 hours before your appointment. If your appointment time changes, you will also be notified.

During the booking process, you will have the opportunity to select a vaccination clinic closest to you.


