





Accompany One Another in Love This week, we reflect on what it means to truly walk with others in their suffering. Jesus never turned away from those who were sick, lonely, or grieving. He stayed. He calls us to do the same.

**REVERENCE FOR LIFE MONTH** Many people choose Euthanasia/MAiD not because of physical pain, but because of emotional distress, loneliness, or fear of being burdensome. There are even vulnerable people being offered MAiD even when they have not asked for it. In moments of fear or isolation, this message can deepen despair.

The good news is that we live in the hope of Easter, celebrating Christ's victory over death and the promise of new life. No one should suffer alone.

What Can We Do? Reach out to someone who may be feeling forgotten. A visit, a phone call, or a quiet moment of prayer can bring comfort and restore dignity. We also encourage you to explore the Canadian Conference of Bishops' video series "Horizon of Hope" and the CMDA Canada video series "Dying with Christ, Living with Hope." This gentle resource helps us learn what real accompaniment looks like and how to bring it into our relationships and communities.

We will be hosting Horizons of Hope/Dying with Christ, Living with Hope on Saturday, May 31st at 9:30 am. A link is available our parish website to register. Let us continue building a community where no one suffers alone.

**Did You Know?** Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) is now the fifth leading cause of death in Canada. In 2023, one in twenty Canadians who died did so through MAiD. Since legalization, over 60,000 Canadians have died by euthanasia or assisted suicide.

Many who request MAiD are not in physical pain. The number one reason given for requesting MAiD is "loss of meaningful activities." What is more meaningful than loving someone, or allowing them to love you? This is not a medical problem, it is a spiritual and existential one. This is a human struggle that deserves a human response. We are not meant to be alone, but to be surrounded by our loved ones, and to call them close to us. Let us walk together in love and be the healing presence of Christ for others.


