April 30th, 2021 FINANCIAL UPDATE

1. April Year to Date Financial Results - Operations:

• April year-to-date financial results reflect a surplus of \$32,329.

• A closer look at Mass Collections and Donations:

Revenues: When the 2021 budget was prepared it was planned with the hopes of more people being able to attend Mass, which would have resulted in higher Mass Collections and lower Donations, unfortunately to date that has not happened, but we are very hopeful moving forward.

Therefore the year to date Mass Collections are \$23,933 lower than budgeted but gratefully the year to date overall donations are \$16,111 higher than budgeted.

2. Remaining debt as of April 30th, 2021 is: \$957,878

One of the finance council goals this year is to focus on debt repayment, in March we made a lump sum payment towards debt of \$150,000.

3. The Government of Canada Wage Subsidy program has been extended into 2021. We are so appreciative of this support for the Parish.
