





MARCH, 2020 FINANCIAL UPDATE

1. March Year-to-Date Financial Results - Operations:

- March year-to-date financial results still reflect a Surplus of \$37,902.
- Because of the tremendous start to 2020, this remains a positive message. However, this surplus has begun to erode as compared to the February financial results, which reported a Surplus of \$49,632.
- Year-to-date Mass Collections are now trending lower than planned by approximately \$16,000. This is attributed to the suspension of Masses since March 22, due to the Covid19 Pandemic.
- Year-to-Date Donations are now trending lower than planned by approximately \$11,000. This is primarily attributed to the overall economic uncertainty that currently exists and a timing difference regarding receipt of a one-time donation.



2. March Monthly Financial Results - Operations:

- March monthly financial results reflect a Deficit of (\$11,731).
- As previously mentioned, this outcome is primarily attributed to the suspension of Masses since March 22 and the current climate of economic uncertainty.

3. Debt: Remaining debt at March 31 is: \$1,231,600.

Moving forward into April - Giving Trends:

- Pre-Authorized Givers (Electronic) contributions have remained relatively stable, with some parishioners now moving to this form of giving and some existing Pre-Authorized Givers increasing their weekly or monthly contributions.
- Envelope Givers contributions have been negatively impacted due to the suspension of Masses. However, some contributions are now being received in new ways as these parishioners have chosen other alternatives, such as:
 - o Dropping off their Envelope contributions in the mailbox at the Parish Office; or
 - o Providing contributions via electronic methods, such as e-Transfer, PayPal, Canada Helps or as previously mentioned, electing to become a Pre-Authorized Giver.
- Donations (Recurring or Periodic) Donations typically received via PayPal, e-Transfers, cheques or cash, and not connected to Masses, continue, but have experienced a downward trend, primarily attributed to these uncertain economic times we are now in.

Please watch for the April financial results to be shared about mid-May. Also, please don't hesitate to contact the Finance Office (Terry 306-352-0901 or Karen 306-352-0730) with any questions or concerns you may have regarding Giving alternatives or Parish finances.

In summary, we thank you all for your continued generosity. We also recognize that some of you may be experiencing difficult financial circumstances at this time. Please know that we understand that you may not be able to support the Parish in a financial way right now, and we offer our prayers for each of you and your families during this time.
