

Salvation History



Salvation history tells us the story of how God has been present for us since the beginning. Starting in the Old Testament the Bible tells how God has endlessly tried to reach us, to save us, to tell us of his love and mercy. Through a history lens we are able to put the Bible stories in the context of an historical timeline and see the progression of God's love and promises known as Covenants. This historical and covenant view is the backdrop of God's plan for the salvation for each of us.



In the secular world, a covenant is temporary agreement or promise for the exchange of goods and services. In a Bible covenant nothing is exchanged, it is a permanent bond between God and his people. The intention of God's covenants is to lead us to act in harmony with each other and according to His teachings.

There are four things in common with every covenant:
(1) blessing, (2) condition / curse, (3) sign and (4) a resulting family form.

There are six basic covenants God made with his people, do you know what they are?

Baptism Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. - Acts 2:38

The Sacrament of Baptism is often called "The door to the Church," because it is the first of the seven Sacraments, not only chronologically, but also in priority. The reception of all other Sacraments depends on baptism. It is the first of the three Sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion. Once baptized, a person becomes a member of the Body of Christ, the Church.





Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful in the current pandemic

In a special decree, issued on October 22, the Apostolic Penitentiary has said that “this year, in the current circumstances due to the “Covid-19” pandemic, the Plenary Indulgences for deceased faithful will be extended throughout the entire month of November, with adaptation of works and conditions to guarantee the safety of the faithful.”

This includes changes to indulgences provided for private prayer for the deceased in a church and for visitation of a cemetery to pray for the deceased. In the case of private prayer in a church, individuals unable to attend a church at this time due to illness or other pandemic-related factors, may do so within their own homes as well. Both of these pious practices may be transferred to any other day of an individual’s choosing throughout the month of November.

All three of the readings today are end of time in nature. In the first reading, the writer personifies a heavenly wisdom, making note that this wisdom, which is clearly beyond this world, is readily available for those who prudently live their lives seeking it. In the second reading, Paul addresses the Thessalonians about those who have died, assuring them that, through His death and resurrection, Christ has won the victory for us. Therefore, those who die in Christ will be raised. In the gospel, the five foolish bridesmaids miss the arrival of the bridegroom because they were not prepared. It is clear that the message of today’s readings is one that is beyond this world. They communicate to us about life hereafter. The lesson is this: if you are not prepared for the heavenly feast, you will be locked out forever! It is a sobering reminder of God’s love and justice. We don’t know when the Lord’s return will take place or when we will be ushered from this world. So as Christians, stewards of God’s manifold gifts, we must use wisely and timely all of our time, talents and treasure. The Archbishop’s Appeal provides us with the opportunity to invest wisely all of our gifts in the future, beyond this world that has been entrusted to the Church of the Archdiocese of Regina.
