





Ecumenical Advent Series: What Are We Waiting For? What are we waiting for?

As Christmas and the holidays approach, Christians experience the season of Advent as a time of expectant waiting and preparation. This year, there will be a special ecumenical series of Advent meditations and conversations on the question: "What are we waiting for?," with Canadian church leaders, including:

- Rev. Dr. Robert Faris, Moderator, The Presbyterian Church of Canada
- Rev. Susan C. Johnson, National Bishop, Evangelical Lutheran Church of Canada
- Right Rev. Dr. Carmen Lansdowne, Moderator, The United Church of Canada
- Most Rev. Linda Nicholls, Primate, Anglican Church of Canada

On each Thursday in Advent (Dec. 1, 8, 15, and 22), listeners are invited to join a live discussion at 6:00 pm SK time, via Zoom, with one of the leaders on that week's Advent theme. Attendees will be able to ask questions during the online conversation.

Also, each Monday during Advent, the church leaders will release an ecumenical Advent meditation focused on one of the four Advent themes and will address challenges and opportunities facing the Canadian churches.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2023 - Do good; seek justice (Isaiah 1:17) January 18 to 25, 2023

Learning to do right requires the decision to engage in self-reflection. The Week of Prayer is a time set aside for Christians to recognize that the divisions between our churches cannot be separated from divisions within the wider human family. Praying together for Christian unity allows us to reflect on what unites us and to commit ourselves to confront oppression and division amongst humanity.

The 2023 WPCU resources were developed by the Minnesota Council of Churches. They reflect the ecumenical work on racial justice in the U.S. following the murder of George Floyd in Minneapolis in May 2020.

Resources are now available at <u>https://weekofprayer.ca</u>, including an order of worship, hymn suggestions, 8 days of scripture reflections on the theme, and materials for children and youth.

Ecumenical Log Drivers: Forming Agents of Reconciliation for Church and World


The 2023 De Margerie Lectures on Christian Reconciliation and Unity Rt. Rev. Bruce Myers, OGS (Anglican Bishop of Quebec)

In the past century the ecumenical movement has made extraordinary efforts in healing the wounds of division in the the church. However, despite efforts to educate and inspire successive generations of Christian leaders about the quest for the church's visible unity, an ecumenical malaise has set in which ignorance, fear, mistrust, suspicion, stereotypes, caricatures, recrimination, anathematization-even persecution continue in the relations between divided churches. Drawing on decades of reflection on ecumenical reception and formation, Bishop Myers presents an approach to teaching the practical and theological aspects of ecumenism in a way that is both holistic and pragmatic and offers the potential to raise up a new generation of church leaders who are also agents of reconciliation and Christian unity.

Bishop Myers has been bishop of Quebec since 2017. Raised on a farm in Glengarry County, Ontario, he studied at the University of Toronto before a decade as a parliamentary correspondent in Ottawa and Quebec City. He completed his theological studies at McGill University, Montreal Diocesan



doctor of ministry at St. Paul University in Ottawa. He is a professed member of the Order of the Good Shepherd, an international community of Anglicans who share a common rule of life. Before election as bishop, he served parishes in Quebec City and the Magdalen Islands, and as Coordinator for Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations for the Anglican Church of Canada.

The De Margerie Lectures are named in honour of Fr. Bernard de Margerie, a priest of the Diocese of Saskatoon who has dedicated his whole life in ministry to the promotion of Christian unity. In this 11th year of the lecture series, we are expanding to offer lectures in both Regina and Saskatoon under the sponsorship of St. Thomas More College, the Prairie Centre for Ecumenism, the Archdiocese of Regina, and Campion College.

1. October Year to Date Financial Results - Operations:


• October year-to-date financial results reflect a surplus of \$82,964

• A closer look at Mass Collections and Donations:

Revenues:

The year to date Mass collections are \$13,747 lower than budgeted as well overall donations are \$1662 lower than budgeted. The budget was prepared last year with the anticipation there would be an increase in Mass attendance for fall 2022, the attendance has remained stable.

Expenses: Our expenses are 13.4% less than budgeted year to date, however a few of the expenses that were budgeted for earlier in year may happen in November or December. Our part time youth position is still vacant.



- 2. Remaining debt as of October 31st, 2022 is: **\$569,737.**
- **3.** One of our finance council goals at this time is to focus on debt repayment. Because of your amazing ongoing support of our Parish, in April our Parish was able to make a large debt repayment of \$196,895 towards our long term debt of the Phase II of the building.

Secular Franciscans

A Franciscan Vocation for Catholic Women or Men, Married or Single: Do you want to be a better Catholic? Draw nearer to God? Become more Christ-like? Perhaps you have a vocation to a of men and women, married and single, who live and work in the world, but who follow a way of life that's faithful to the original Rule written by St. Francis of Assisi, but adapted to today's circumstances. Members of the Order find direction, inspiration, encouragement and support to reach spiritual goals in a community (fraternity) of Secular Franciscans near your community.

History: In 1209, St. Francis of Assisi established the First Oder of the Franciscan family (Order of Friars Minor) for men. Later with St. Clare of Assisi, he founded the Second Order (the Poor Clares), and finally in 1221, he instituted the Third Order (Secular Franciscans) for men and women who were unable to leave their homes, families, or work.

What is involved: Secular Franciscans to not take vows. Instead, they make a pledge (or solemn promises) to observe for life the Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order. Admission is open to anyone who is not already a member of another religious or secular Order, who is 18 years or older, a practicing Catholic of good moral character, peace-loving and faithful to the teachings of the Church and loyal to the Apostolic See.
