

This year we are celebrating 50 years of contributing to the musical life of our city and the province.

We will be presenting two works that span over 200 years. The first is the *Coronation Mass* composed by Mozart in 1779. This short, majestic piece has grand choral sections, beautiful solos for soprano, tenor, alto and bass, deeply moving duets, and a solo quartet bursting with energy and joy.

Our second piece, *Magnificat* by English composer John Rutter, was first presented in Carnegie Hall, New York in 1990. *Magnificat* is a musical setting of the canticle of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Luke 1: 46-55). The canticle is thought to be Mary's poetic outpouring of praise, joy and trust in God on learning that she was to give birth to Christ. The composition, sung in Latin, is in seven movements for soprano and choir, interspersed with "Of a Rose, a lovely Rose", an anonymous English poem.
