On the weekend Mass will be celebrated on Saturday at 5:00 PM, on Sunday at 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM.



The Purpose of Couples Connect

First, to give the individual couples an opportunity to connect on an intellectual level from:

- the in-depth, real-life information presented by knowledgeable speakers
- their personal discussion times
- the Q&A session with the presenters and Fr. Rick

Secondly, to have the couples **connect** with other couples to form a future support system.

And *thirdly*, for couples to develop a *connection* within the Catholic faith community to help enrich their faith formation

The 8 session program runs once per year, December to March on Sunday afternoons for 3 hours. A session consists of two 40 minute talks, private couple discussion time after each talk and coffee/snack breaks. 

Let us ask the Holy Spirit to help us become more aware of ways to pay attention to and say our yes to God's invitation to friendship - the "eternal banquet". 




