






1st Reading: Exodus 17.8-13 2nd Reading: 2 Timothy 3.14 – 4.2 Gospel: Luke 18.1-8

Anyone who has tried to start a new exercise regimen or learn an instrument understands that it takes persistence. Being persistent in anything is hard though — it asks us to endure resistance, at times being uncomfortable or boring. The readings today help us understand that our faith is like a muscle that needs to be exercised. At times our faith comes easily, but other times it takes persistence to grow in the spiritual life. The account of Moses being persistent in his help to the army of Israel, Paul's exhortation to Timothy to be persistent in following the Gospel, and Jesus's parable of the dishonest judge show us that we must be persistent in our faith. • September year-to-date financial results reflect a surplus of \$82,656


A closer look at Mass Collections and Donations:

### Revenues:

The year to date Mass collections are \$9,366 lower than budgeted as well overall donations are \$209 lower than budgeted. The budget was prepared last year with the anticipation there would be an increase in Mass attendance for fall 2022, with the hopes that the pandemic was behind us and we would be returning to pre covid numbers.

*Expenses:* Our expenses are 13.1% less than budgeted year to date, however some of the expenses that were budgeted for earlier in year may still happen this fall. Our sacrament position has now been filled however our part time youth position that is still vacant.

- 2. Remaining debt as of September 30th, 2022 is: \$580,860.
- **3.** One of our finance council goals at this time is to focus on debt repayment. Because of your amazing ongoing support of our Parish, in April our Parish was able to make a large debt repayment of \$196,895 towards our long term debt of the Phase II of the building.



# If you have life, you have questions. If you have a Catechism, you have answers!

What is a catechism?

The word catechism comes from a Greek word that means "to echo". For the Catholic Church, catechism refers to passing along the teachings of Jesus given to the apostles. The Catechism of the Catholic Church is a book that every Catholic should own. It contains everything Jesus wants the Church to teach about living-out the reality of the Catholic Faith as God reveals it. It is a perfect union of knowledge and living where truth and love exist together, as summed up by Jesus' words: Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do. A catechism is a text that is conveyed in a way to help understand the fundamental Christian truths. The Catechism is divided into four sections that are considered the pillars of faith: 1.) The Creed, 2.) The Sacraments & Liturgy, 3.) Life in Christ (morality) and 4.) Prayer.
