





1. Sept Year to Date Financial Results - Operations:


- Sept year-to-date financial results reflect a surplus of \$72,409.
- A closer look at Mass Collections and Donations:

Revenues:

The year to date Mass collections are \$39,818 lower than budgeted but gratefully the year to date overall donations are \$28,576 higher than budgeted. The 2021 budget was originally planned with the hopes of more people being able to attend Mass earlier in the year, however that did not happen until mid-year.

Expenses: Management continues to focus on cost effectiveness, our expenses are 8.9% less than budgeted year to date.

2. Remaining debt as of Sept 30th, 2021 is: \$906,725.

One of the finance council goals this year is to focus on debt repayment, in March we made a lump sum payment of \$150,000 towards our debt.

3. The Government of Canada Wage Subsidy program has been extended into 2021. We are grateful for this funding to the Parish.




