So, when Zacchaeus pledges to make amends to the poor and any he extorted, it is clear that his faith in Christ changed his life. The Catechism: the unhacked truth!

For whom is the Catechism intended? The *Catechism* is first intended for bishops, who are the primary catechists considered to be the foremost teachers of the faith and first pastors of the Church within the diocese. Through the bishops, the priests, deacons and all those given the duty to catechize are teachers of catechesis. While the Catechism is not intended to be directly read by young people or children, St. Pope John Paul II recognized the study of Catechism that provides faithful adults a better understanding of the riches of salvation. The Catechism stresses that a well-formed conscience is upright and truthful and educating the conscience is a lifelong task. Coupled with Sacred Scripture, the Catechism should guide the formation and education toward a welldeveloped conscience.
