

When He was sent to us, Jesus knew He would die and He knew how, but He came anyway. He did just as His Father asked.


By comparison His Father, our Father, asks very little of us and repeatedly forgives us through the Sacrament of Reconciliation when we fail.


#### Deut 6:2-6 | Heb 7:23-28 | Mk 12:28-34

Our attention in Mark's gospel is drawn to the interaction between Jesus and a scribe, well-versed in scripture, who comes near to Jesus to ask "Which commandment is the first of all". Jesus begins his answer by reiterating the expression of faith integral to the covenantal relationship of the people of Israel with God. Bringing full expression to the potential and promise within the words of Moses found in Deuteronomy, Jesus deepens our understanding

by extending the law to include that complete love for God into our encounter with our neighbour. Through this inclusion, the intention of all scripture finds fulfillment and the essence of the law is fully expressed. Jesus proclaims in both word and action this commandment of love, to the point of his definitive sacrifice on the cross for our eternal salvation and invites us as his followers to a conversion of heart from Our Goal which we respond with a new mode of living.

The call to love one another, to promote justice and equity within our society, challenges those priorities and values which seem so prevalent in our world and are often counter to Christ's teaching. We are called to respond generously and to selflessly offer ourselves and our talents towards the service of one another through our positive and loving actions in our daily lives. Catholic Social Teaching is driven by the fundamental principle that each person is the clearest reflection of God among us and we share a special relationship with each other as being created by God, redeemed by Christ and called to communion with God (Pastoral Constitution of the Church in the Modern World). Through your contribution to the Archbishop's Appeal we as a diocese can continue to respond to the Holy Spirit through the work of social justice and make meaningful difference in the world around us. So, let us not only come near to the Kingdom of God. Let us as followers of Christ intentionally and diligently enter fully. Let us allow the love of God to change us and to flow through us in serviceable love.

"And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all the burnt offerings and sacrifices." (Mark 12:33)

•Rabbi Jeremy Parnes is the spiritual leader of Beth Jacob Synagogue in Regina. His long involvement in multifaith and community organizations includes Regina Multifaith Forum, Habitat for Humanity, numerous City of Regina committees on social housing and homelessness, and several inner-city boards, including Youth Connexions and The Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada.

•Rev. Amanda Currie has been minister of First Presbyterian Church in Regina since 2017. She previously ministered in Saskatoon for 14 years and has recently completed a two-year term as Moderator of the Presbyterian Church in Canada. She is vice president of the Canadian Council of Churches, where she has served on the Governing Board for the past 7 years. She has convened the Ecumenical & Interfaith Committee of the Presbyterian Church and is active in numerous national and local ecumenical and interfaith initiatives.

•Imam Dr. Mohamed Masloh is the leader of the Islamic Association of Saskatchewan in Regina, an RCMP chaplain, and a teaching assistant at the University of Regina. He studied at the prestigious Al-Azhar University in Cairo and the Graduate Theological Foundation in Indiana, where he earned a Ph.D. in Islamic Studies. In these days of increased social polarization and intolerance, where racism, antisemitism, and Islamophobia appear to be increasing daily, dialogue between faith communities is an antidote to ignorance and hatred. Generosity, hospitality, and compassion are social virtues that can heal the wounds of our society.
